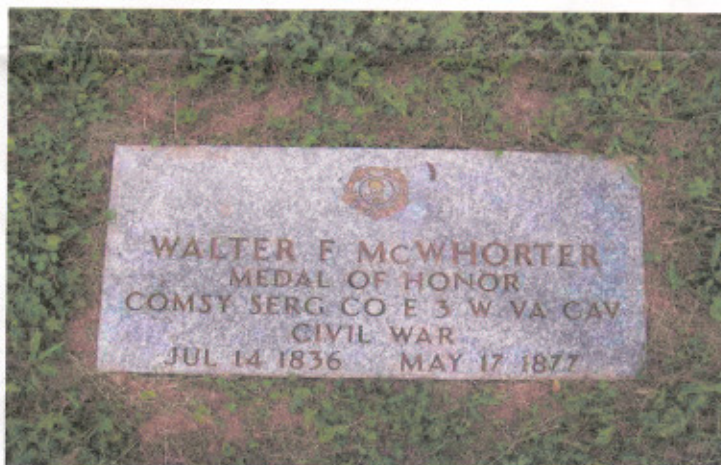


# Civil War Medal of Honor Monument Set at Greenbrier Cemetery



No one would know from the original 1877 monument on his grave (*left*) that Walter McWorter was a veteran who received the Medal of Honor for his Civil War service. Last month, through the efforts of the Medal of Honor Historical Society in Baltimore, his grave was marked with a new granite/bronze marker (*below*) beside the old one.



The photo at left shows a portion of the Greenbrier Cemetery with McWhorter's monument in the center foreground—just beyond a newly closed grave. Burial plots are still available at Greenbrier, three miles outside Salem.
