BORN: July 11, 1767 at Braintree, Massachusetts

FAMILY: Married Louisa Catherine Johnson on July 26, 1797

1 Daughter and 3 Sons including a son named George Washington Adams

John Quincy Adams was the first son of an American President to also be elected President

RELIGION: Unitarian

PROFESSION: Attorney

POLITICAL PARTY: Democratic-Republican

HOME STATE: Massachusetts

POLITICAL OFFICES: Foreign Diplomat, U. S. Senator, Secretary of State

He was subsequently elected to the U.S. House of Representatives AFTER his Presidency.

NICKNAME: "Old Man Eloquent"

DIED: February 23, 1848 (Age - 80) - Two days after collapsing on the floor of the House of Representatives where he was serving as a Congressman from Massachusetts.

LAST WORDS: *"Thank the officers of the House (of Representatives). This is the last of earth. I am content."*

BURIED: First Unitarian Church, Quincy, Massachusetts

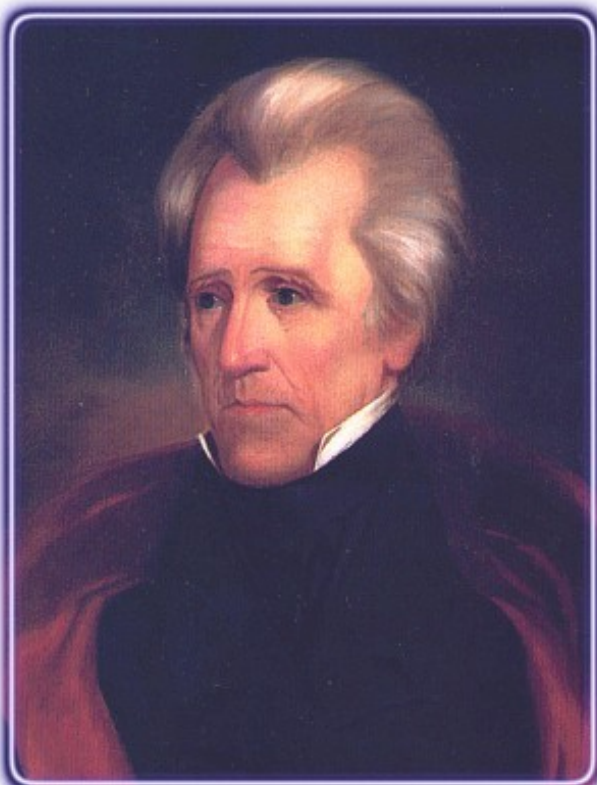

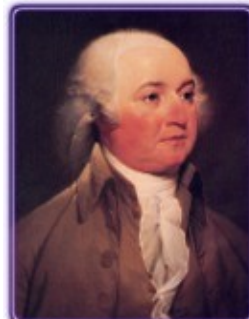
SEVENTH U.S. PRESIDENT

Andrew Jackson's wife Rachel died after the election but before the Inauguration. Jackson never remarried and there was no First Lady during his presidency.



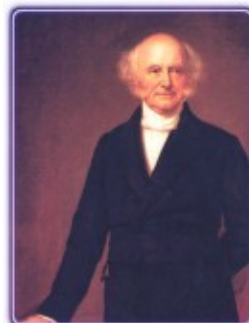

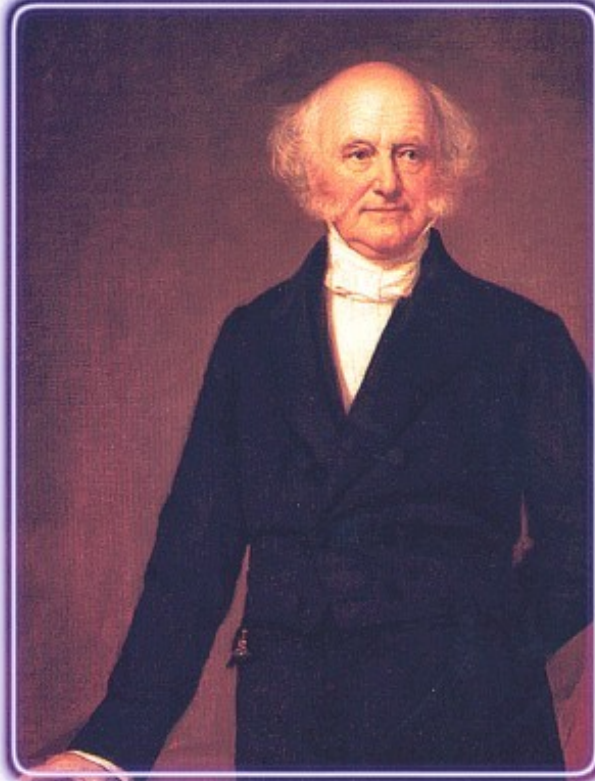

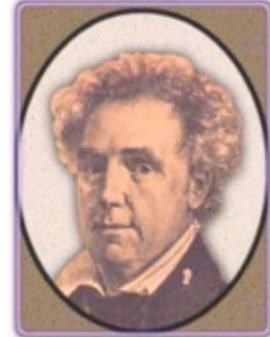
EIGHTH U.S. PRESIDENT

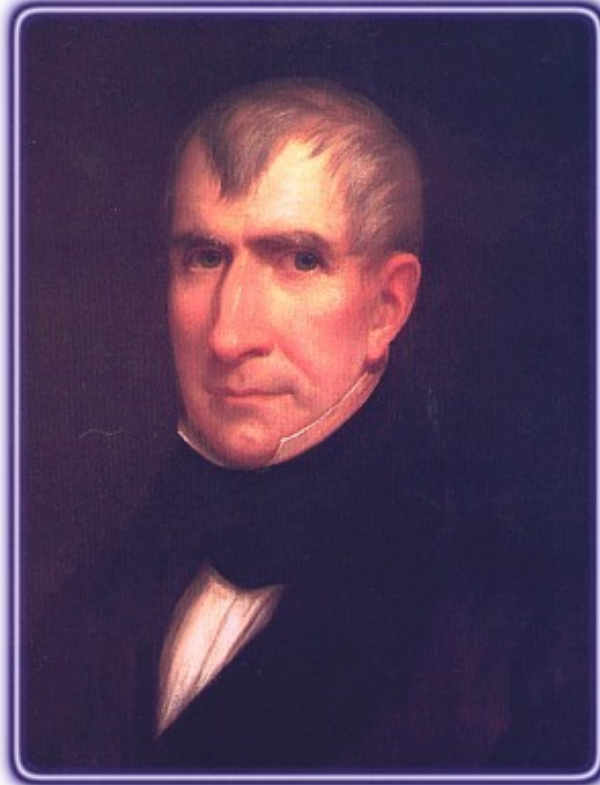

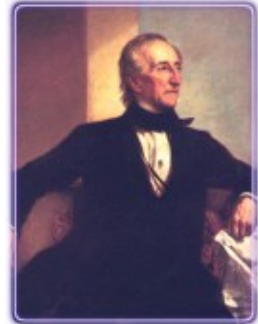

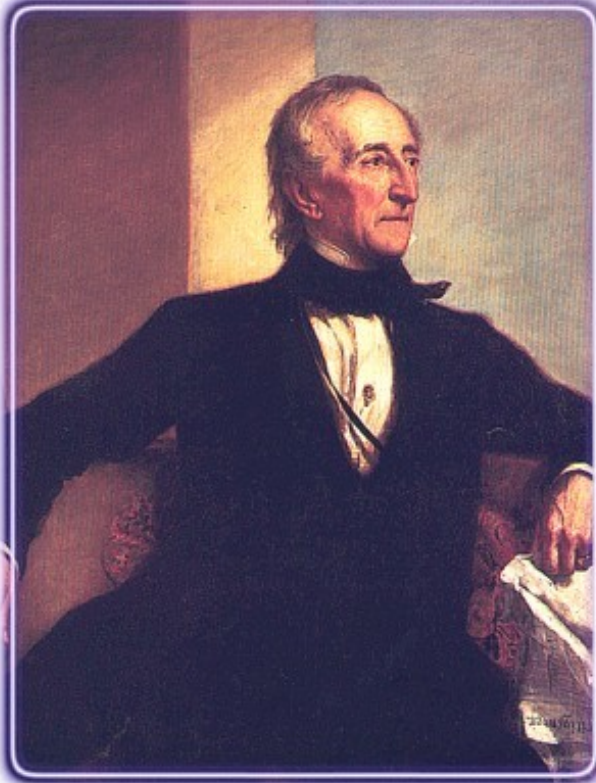

TENTH U.S. PRESIDENT

Tyler's first wife Letitia died the year after her husband became president (the 1st First Lady to die in the White House.) Two years later Tyler married Julia Gardiner, at age 24, thirty years younger than himself.

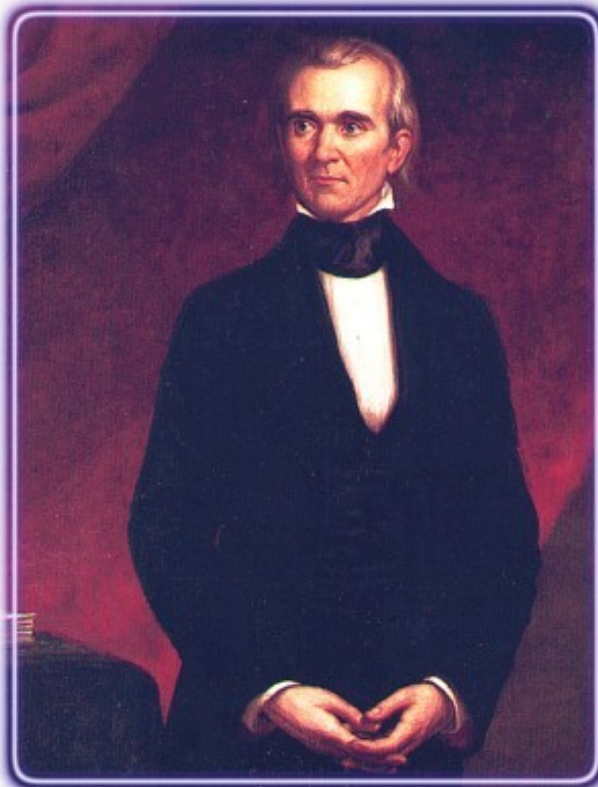

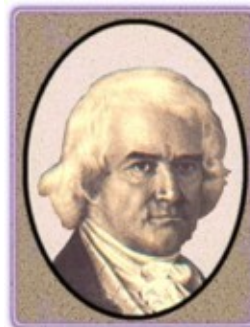

DIED: June 15, 1849 (Age - 53) – *Three months after leaving the White House*

BURIED: State Capitol Grounds, Nashville, Tennessee

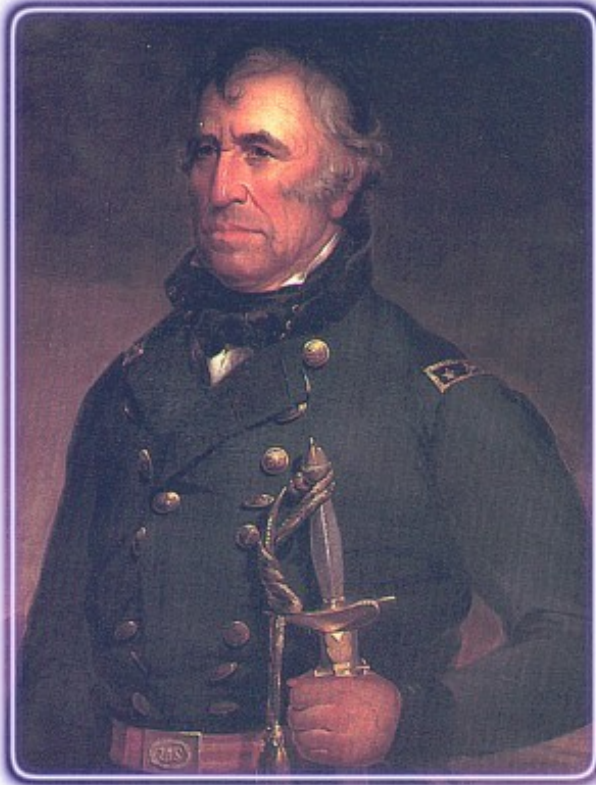

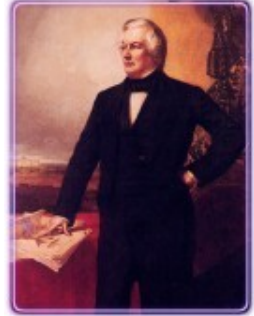

One of his daughters married Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederacy

RELIGION: Episcopalian

MILITARY SERVICE: Major General, U. S. Army (Combat Veteran War of 1812 & Indian Wars)

PROFESSION: Professional Soldier

POLITICAL PARTY: Whig

HOME STATE: Louisiana

POLITICAL OFFICES: None Zachary Taylor came to the White House with extensive leadership experience, but no political experience

NICKNAME: "Old Rough and Ready"

DIED: July 9, 1850 (Age - 65)

***Died in office 5 days after dedicating the Washington Monument.**

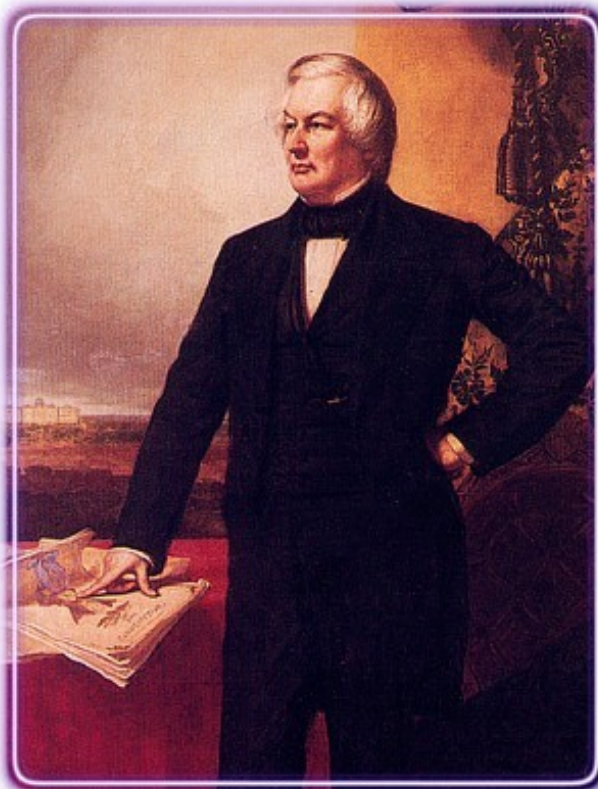
BURIED: Zachary Taylor National Cemetery, Louisville, Kentucky

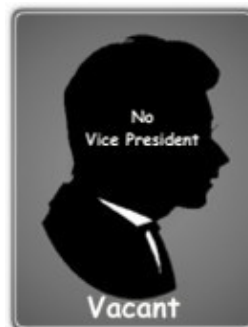

Married Caroline Carmichael McIntosh on February 10, 1858

RELIGION: Unitarian

PROFESSION: Teacher/Attorney

POLITICAL PARTY: Whig

HOME STATE: New York

POLITICAL OFFICES: U. S. Congressman, Chairman of House Ways and Means Committee, unsuccessful candidate for governor of New York (1844), Vice President.

NICKNAME: "Father of our Country"

DIED: March 8, 1874 (Age - 74)

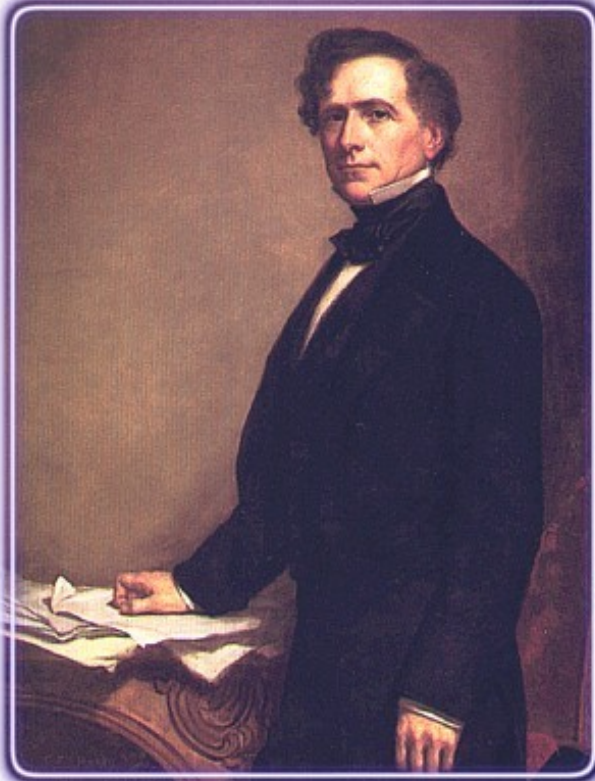
BURIED: Forest Lawn Cemetery, Buffalo, New York

Three Sons (The Pierce's first son died 3 days after birth and another died at age 4 from typhus. After his election and before the inauguration, Franklin Pierce's only remaining son, 11-year-old Benjamin Pierce, was killed in a train wreck. (Mr. and Mrs. Pierce escaped unharmed from the same wreck.)

RELIGION: Episcopalian

MILITARY SERVICE: Brigadier General, US Army (Combat Veteran—War with Mexico)

PROFESSION: Attorney/Public Official

POLITICAL PARTY: Democratic

HOME STATE: New Hampshire

POLITICAL OFFICES: Speaker of N.H. state legislature, U.S. Representative, U.S. Senator

NICKNAME: "Young Hickory of the Granite Hills"

DIED: October 8, 1869 (Age - 64)

BURIED: Old North Cemetery, Concord, New Hampshire

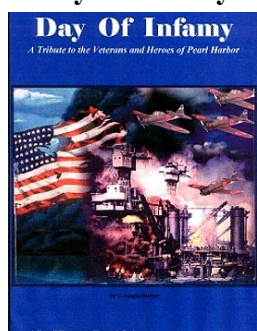
Presidential Facts and Trivia

- The word **President** comes from the Latin word "prasidens" meaning to preside over or hold a high position of authority.
- Eight presidents have died while holding office, two of them (Harrison and Taylor) actually succumbing in their beds in the Executive Mansion. Four of these eight Presidents died at the hands of an assassin. Three former presidents died on the 4th of July
 - **Thomas Jefferson** and **John Adams** on July 4, 1826
 - **James Monroe** on July 4, 1831
- One president, **Calvin Coolidge**, was born on the Fourth of July.
- Only ONE president, **George Washington**, has had a state named for him. One state was originally incorporated under the name "Jefferson" as much of its territory was acquired under President Jefferson's *Louisiana Purchase*. When that state was admitted to the union however, is elected to adopt statehood under the name *Colorado*. Four states have named their capitol cities for presidents:
 - Missouri -- *Jefferson City*
 - Wisconsin – *Madison*
 - Mississippi – *Jackson*
 - Nebraska – *Lincoln*
- Prior to the year 2001 **John Adams** (2nd President) and **John Quincy Adams** (6th President) were the only father and son to both become President. They share that unique distinction now with **George H.W. Bush** (41st President) and **George W. Bush** (our current president). Other presidents who had family relationships include:
 - William H. Harrison (9th) and his grandson Benjamin Harrison (23rd)
 - **James Madison** (4th) and his second cousin **Zachary Taylor** (12th)
 - **Theodore Roosevelt** (26th) was the fifth cousin of **Franklin Delano Roosevelt** (32nd). FDR was related by blood to four other presidents and by marriage to six additional presidents including George Washington, John Adams, James Madison, John Quincy Adams, Martin Van Buren, William H. Harrison, Zachary Taylor, Ulysses S. Grant, Benjamin Harrison, and William H. Taft.
- Abraham Lincoln's son **Robert Todd Lincoln** was a serious contender for the Republican presidential nomination in both 1884 and 1888. During his lifetime he was present or near the assassination of three presidents (Lincoln, Garfield, and McKinley.) After McKinley's assassination in 1901 he became convinced he was a presidential *jinx* and refused to attend further presidential functions.
- Only one U.S. President has earned the Medal of Honor. President Clinton belatedly presented it to Theodore Roosevelt's family on January 16, 2001. The sons of **TWO** American presidents have been awarded Medals of Honor:
 - President Rutherford B. Hayes' son **Lieutenant Colonel Webb Cook Hayes** earned the Medal of Honor for his heroism in the Philippine Insurrection on December 4, 1899
 - The other presidential son to earn the Medal of Honor was the son of Theodore Roosevelt, **Brigadier General Theodore Roosevelt, Jr.** General Roosevelt was awarded a posthumous Medal of Honor after landing with American forces on the D-Day invasion at Normandy on June 6, 1944. The two Roosevelts share the unique distinction of being the **ONLY** father/son Medal of Honor recipients with **Lieutenant Arthur MacArthur** (Civil War) and his son **General Douglas MacArthur** (World War II).
